

Cleveland VOTES Thank you for your commitment to democracy!

"As we take time to reflect on the *extended* Primary Election there are a few items of note that we as Cleveland VOTES hope will inform and influence the road ahead of the 2020 General Election on November 3rd, 2020. Voter Turnout for the 2020 Primary Election in Cuyahoga County was 22.4%, which means that roughly 2 out of 5 registered voters turned out for an election that was unexpectedly extended and for the first time in recent history, largely vote-at-home-by-mail. The total number of ballots cast were 192,065 out of 858,057 registered voters in Cuyahoga County. This is a dismal drop from the 2016 Primary Election, at 361,098 ballots cast out of 849, 206 registered voters which means that we had a voter turnout of 42.5%. In other words, when we compare the voter turnout between the 2016 and 2020 Primary Elections, it is revealed that we experienced nearly a 50% decrease in voter turnout amongst registered voters. In fact, this was the lowest voter turnout in a presidential primary in recent history. Voter turnout even sank lower this year than in

2018's congressional primaries."

Description

Voter registration is more important than ever this year. With DMVs across the country shuttered because of COVID-19, and field-based registration drives on hold, millions of voter registrations are no longer being collected or updated. At the same time, in order to be able to take advantage of some of the options being rolled out in the states to reduce the spread of COVID-19 – such as vote by mail – eligible voters need to be registered at their current addresses well ahead of Election Day.
